 both as respects my family and myself that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind
 providence has blessed me I do therefore make this my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all others by me
 heretofore made

Item 1st I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christianlike manner suitable to my circumstances
 and condition in life. My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it as I hope for salvation
 through the merits and atonement of our blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ

Item 2nd I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executor hereinafter named and appointed
 Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary, one undivided half interest in lot of land number (one) in Block C
 E. fronting Marble Street in the Town of Rockmont in Polk County Georgia with all the rights members and appurtenances
 in anywise belonging to said interest free from all charge and limitation whatever to her own proper use benefit and
 behoof forever with full power to dispose of the same by will or otherwise as she may deem proper. I also give
 and bequeath to my beloved wife in the same comprehensive manner all of my house hold and kitchen furniture and all
 of the real grown or growing during the present year on lots of land numbers 1030, 1031, 1022, 1023, & 1077 in the
 2nd District and 3rd Section in Polk County Georgia and the property divided and bequeathed in the above articles to
 my wife is in full extinguishment of her whole right of Dower in my real estate

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth L. Wall wife of Thomas Wall one undivided half interest in lot of
 land number (one) in Block C, fronting Marble Street in the Town of Rockmont in Polk County Georgia with all
 the rights members and appurtenances in anywise belonging to said interest whatever to her own proper use benefit
 and behoof forever with full power to dispose of the same by will or otherwise as she may deem proper
 free from the debts and liabilities of her husband

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Ann Maddell wife of Alfred Maddell, lot of land number -
 1048 one thousand and forty eight in the 2nd District and 3rd Section in Polk County Georgia containing 40 -
 acres more or less with all the rights members and appurtenances in anywise belonging thereto to her own proper
 use benefit and behoof forever with full power to dispose of the same by will or otherwise as she may
 deem proper free from the debts and liabilities of her husband

Item 6th I desire and direct that my Executor hereinafter named shall sell the residue of my real and personal
 property except the crop grown and growing during the present year on lot number 1046 in the 2nd District
 and 3rd Section in Polk County Georgia this crop I give and bequeath to my son Joel Attkins and in addition
 to said crop I give and bequeath to my said son Joel Attkins one thousand and fifty Dollars to be paid to him out
 of my estate by my Executor for improvements made on said lot by my said son I also give and bequeath
 to my son Joel Attkins one thousand and fifty Dollars to be paid to him by my Executor out of the proceeds of the
 sale of my real and personal estate

Item 7th I desire and direct that my executor sell the remainder of my property not already bequeathed either at public
 or private sale as he may think will be to the interest of the beneficiaries under this will

Item 8th It is my desire that my son James Attkins is not to pay any interest on a note given me by him for
 lot of land number 1046 in the 2nd District & 3rd Section in Polk County Georgia said note being for Two thousand and forty five

Item 9th I desire and direct that my Executor pay to the persons hereinafter named the sums to be hereafter stated out of the proceeds of the sale of my real and personal estate as follows. To my son Jephtha V. Atkins one Hundred and twenty Dollars. To my son James M. Atkins one Hundred and twenty Dollars. To my son George M. Atkins one Hundred and twenty Dollars. To my son Elias Atkins one Hundred and forty four Dollars. To my son Myatt Atkins one Hundred and twenty Dollars. To my daughter Nancy C. Shewmaker one Hundred and thirty Dollars. To each of my grand daughters to wit Ellen Modell, Mary Ella McRae and Mintha Atkins daughters of Nathaniel Atkins forty Dollars. To my daughter Isma Agan one Hundred and twenty Dollars. It is my desire that the amounts given and bequeathed in the foregoing Articles to my daughters and grand daughters shall be free and exempt from the debts and liabilities of the husbands of such daughters and grand daughters in each case where they have a husband.

Item 10th I desire and direct that after the legacies herebefore named have been paid if there be any money left of the proceeds of the sale of my property by the collection of my debts or otherwise, that my Executor divide the same share and share alike between my sons Jephtha V. Joel, Esq., James M., George M., Elias, Myatt, my daughters Nancy C., Isma Agan, Mary Agan, & my grand daughters, Ellen Modell, Mary Ella McRae and Mintha Atkins, daughters of Nathaniel Atkins with this exception said grand daughters are only to have the same amount to be divided between them that one of my sons or daughters may have.

Item 11th I hereby constitute and appoint my son James M. Atkins Executor of this my last will and testament this 19th day of July 1876
