I, Sennah L. Brown widow of Vincent Brown (late of Barlow County deceased) being of advanced age, but being of sound and disposing mind and memory, have thought proper to dispose of the little property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, do therefore make and establish this my last will and testament, to wit,

Item 1st I will and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Brown and her heirs should she ever have any, the one half of my place wherein I now live in said County of Polk and in the eighth section of the third section of said County, there being three forty acre lots of land, the whole tract

Item 2nd I will and bequeath to my daughter Julia A. Brown and to my little grand son Abner Forest Brown the other half of my said tract of land to equally divided between them.

Item 3rd I will and bequeath to my said daughters Elizabeth and Julia A. Brown all my household stock and other personal property of every kind, to be equally divided between them, all my other children having been married, and having received sums equal if not greater when they were married. I intentionally divide the little left as above, and because my two sons Joseph and Craig having paid half the purchase money when I bought the place and requested me then and affirmed to give it to my said two daughters, and that it is only just, and not making or intending to make any difference between my children.
