this my last Will and Testament

1st I Comanded my Soul to God and my body to its Mother Earth to be buried in a decent and Christian Manner
I desire that all my just debts if any shall be truly paid and discharged

2^d I Give and bequeath to my Sons Samuel and John H. C. and to my daughters Jane, Caroline, Mary, Pendergast
the same Goods my Clothing together with such Beds Bedding and other household furniture & such as they may
have received at their respective marriages. And it is furthermore my will that they or either of them or their
heirs shall not receive any thing more out of my Estate.

3^d I Give and bequeath unto my five Daughters now living and residing with me viz. Sarah B. Margrett
Rebecca, Deborah, & Elizabeth all the goods and chattels that may be seized and taken up of my
Estate Consisting of Household and Kitchen furniture. Two Cows, five head of cattle and lot of dark
Hogs, Plantation Tools &c. to be equally divided between the said Sarah B. Margrett, Rebecca, Deborah
and Elizabeth share and share alike

4th I hereby nominate, appoint and constitute Mr. Ebenezer Robinson Executor to this my last Will and
Testament hereby revoking all other will or wills heretofore by me made acknowledging this and this only to be
my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this 13th of June 1855

My wife is empowered to sell any of my personal Estate at private and she is not Required to
make return to the Court of Ordinary farther than

I Appoint my wife Easter Wade sole Executor of this my last will and Testament signed sealed
