the course of an advanced age and knowing that it must shortly depart this life from it right-
and proper both as respects my family and myself that I should make a distribution of the property with
which a kind Providence has blessed me. We therefore make this my last will and Testament hereby revoking
all other Testaments made by me.

I further

desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my
circumstances and condition in life. My wife at first shall return to that with God who gave
of grace and desir'd that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executor. Given at this appoin-
t'd time unwilling my creditors should be delayed in their rights

I have bequeath and devise to my beloved wife money for and during her natural life (as follows)

List of Land Number Two Hundred and Sixteen acres bounded and contained One hundred and fifty
One thousand and fifty-eight, One hundred and thirty, and the south half of One hundred and fifty-eight
the twentieth District & third Section of Peach County Georgia my negro woman Nancy my negro man
David Negro boy favored and negro boy Andrew Jackson Seller his and bequeath to my wife Nancy
during her natural life only, the following slave's used on and belonging to said plantation of my above
written also give and bequeath to my wife Nancy during her natural life only, Gardner
known by the name of Kit, One cow such as she may choose from all my stock of cattle all the house
hold and kitchen furniture belonging to and used on said plantation after giving my children one third
and nothing I give and bequeath to my wife Nancy One year provision

I give and bequeath to my son John Lawson my negro boy Pockahen two to him forever
I give and bequeath to my Son Robert Hethorne the South half of lot of land number one hundred
and twenty seven in the tenth District of Carroll County Said lot of land containing One hundred
two and a half acres, with all the rights, members and privileges to said half lot of land in any way
appertaining or belonging forever, except ten acres including the parcel known as the copper mine
which I wish to be equally divided between all four of my children.

I give and bequeath to my son Edward Christopher my negro boy George to him forever
I give and bequeath to my daughter Joanna Miller my negro Mamie Charly my servant Lucy to her
forever

It is my will at the death of my wife Nancy that all the property not given to my four children
in this my last will and testament be sold, and the proceeds of said sale be so divided between my
four children so that they may all be made equal in the gifts that I have given to them in this my
last will and testament, an account of the division of my children I have given to some more than
to others, But it is my will and desire that each should receive the same amount

I hereby constitute and appoint my son John Lawson Executor of this my last will and Testament
this October 12th 1857 Hawley W. Carter Esq.

Witnessed, declared and published by Hawley W. Carter as his last will and testament in the presence
