

Be it known by all men, I Thomas A. Chisolm being of sound mind but weak in body
do hereby make this my last will and testament.

Item 1st I leave and direct all my just debts to be paid as soon as practicable that I have contracted in the course
of my life and especially to my beloved wife Elizabeth the use of all my property left oral and personal
for her use and support during her life after paying before named debts.

Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Martha Chisolm and my son George Chisolm all my real
and personal estate at the death of my beloved wife equally between them after deducting
amount sufficient to pay debts and other legacies named in my will.

Item 3rd I direct that my Executor furnish to each of my grand children, Harriet, Charles and Alice, as they
become of age a good horse saddle and bridle each, and give to my grand daughters Anna and
one hundred dollars at their marriage or when they come of age.

Item 4th I give to my grand child Annie Fiddell five hundred dollars at the time of her coming of age
after deducting any amount that may be paid out for her education if she is in life at that time

If she should die before the coming of age the above amount to go to my son George and daughter Martha

Item 5th I give to each of my beloved daughters Mary Fiddell and Sally Crook five dollars each and to my
beloved daughter Martha Chisolm five dollars, and also to Dr. Fiddell five dollars.

Item 6th I make constitute and appoint my son George W. Chisolm my Executor to carry into effect this
my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
to this instrument as my last will and testament this the 6th day of December A.D. 1869.

I, Thomas A. Chisolm do solemnly swear that this writing contains the true last will of the above named
Punk healthy, that A. Chisolm deceased so far as I know or believe, and that I will well and truly execute the same
by paying first the debts and then the legacies contained in the said will as far as his goods and
chattels will thenceforth extend and the law charge me, and that I will make a true and perfect
inventory of all such goods and chattels and a just return thereof when thereunto required, subjecting said
