of Polk County 3rd of April 1848 I do make and publish this my last will and Testament hereby revoking & canceling
all and every will by me at any time heretofore made, and first I direct that my body be
interred and that my funeral be conducted in a manner corresponding with my estate and situation
in life. And as to such worldly Estate as I am in possession of, I dispose of the same as follows:
and first I direct that all my debts and funeral expenses to be paid as soon after my death as
possible. Out of the first ^{yearly} income ^{Polk County Wills} realized from my estate. Also I will and bequeath

slave and Eight hundred dollars ^{to be named Jim} to be paid in twelve months after my death.

I will and bequeath Georgia my second daughter and Thomas H. Lockwell William H.

Andrew J. Lockwell, and Thomas H. and Elizabeth Melvina the heirs

of Jane Head each to have a one half of their mother's part. Also will that all my effects
be sold at a public sale and the money so obtained to my son Andrew J. Lockwell to be equally divided on his

and the money decided between each his named also I will and bequeath unto my dear daughter ^{Eliza} wife of Mr. Stockwell the sum of One hundred and a ^{1/2} pence and I hereby appoint Thomas H. Stockwell and William H. Stockwell my executors to carry into effect this my last will and testament. ^{Thomas H. Stockwell}
