to make some disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, I do therefore make this  
deed here as my last will and testament.

Item 1<sup>st</sup>

I resign my soul to God who give it.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup>

I desire and direct that all of my just debts be paid by my Executors herein after mentioned with out delay  
Especially as there is no cause for delay.

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Item 3<sup>rd</sup>

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret Owen my personal and real estate whatever for and during  
natural life or during her widowhood except a sum sufficient to make John and Margaret equal with my other  
children already provided for. And at the death of my said wife I desire and direct that whatever  
property there may be left after providing for John and Margaret be divided equally between  
my children if living and if any should die leaving children then to them.

Item 4<sup>th</sup>

I appoint and nominate my son Anderson Owen as my Executor to this my last will and testament  
declared and published before us this 5<sup>th</sup> day of March 1891
