Peck County I, William Peck of the State and County aforesaid being of Sound and disposing Mind and Memory do make this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made

Item first It is my will and desire that after my death my Executor hereinafter named shall have my body Buried by the side of my late deceased wife And in a reasonable time thereafter to have Erected over each of our graves a Tomb Stone such as in his Judgement shall be suitable

Item second It is my will and desire that my Executor shall as soon as practicable after my death pay all just Outstanding Debts against me

Item Third Having already amply Provided for all my other Children And having in the last eight or ten years given to my daughter Ellen P. Maddell The Plantation on Richford in said County And now Under the Control and Management of her husband John C. Maddell and herself for the use and benefit of herself and children. And having recently given to my daughter Martha A. Calhoun by Deed The Plantation in the 1st District and Third Section of said County known as the John T. Man Place which Deed she the said Martha A. Calhoun accepted with a written relinquishment to all further or other claims on my estate And having also recently by Deed given to my daughter Mary C. Jones The Plantation on which I now reside in the 2nd District and 4th Section of said County which said Deed has been accepted by her with a written relinquishment to all further claim on my Estate And herein and hereby ratifying all the late gifts to my three daughters above named It is my will and desire that at my death all the property of which I am seized and Possessed of every description whatever, real ¹⁸⁴⁸⁻¹⁸⁹¹ ^{www.georgiapioneers.com} and all Credits issues and profits as well as Choses in action and rights Credits subject alone to the payment of my just debts including the Expenses of my last sickness and the erection of the Tombstones over the graves of my late deceased wife And my self referred to in the first item of this my last will and Testament And the Expenses of administration be and belong to my son Julius A. Peck fully and absolutely without further limitation or qualification than is just above mentioned

Item Fourth It is my will and desire that my son Julius A. Peck be the Sole Executor to Carry Out and perform the wishes and desires contained in this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto signed my name and affixed my seal this the Sixth day of February in the Year one Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy nine 1879
