

- I, William D. Wright of said State and County of Building County, being possessed of sound mind and disposing memory being fully in strength and convenient of the certainty of death have thought proper to make and publish this my last Will and Testament in form following to wit:
- I will that my burial expenses and all my just debts be first paid from the proceeds of my Estate.
- I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife two lots of land Lot number Eight Hundred and thirty and Lot number Eight Hundred and seventy three both of the Twenty first Section of the Third Section New Building County and the use of Twenty acres of blessed land in my Plantation one year fore of Rent wherever she may choose. Also thirty seven a Molatto Girl slave about twenty one years old, Also her four children named as follows. Sarah a Girl about six years old, John Francis a boy about four years old, Also Lovidgus a Girl about three years old, Willis Thorsman a boy about six months old. Also one Dutch Bird still one Feather Bird one under Bed. Ten Counters 21 quills down quills six sheets three stand of curtains one Blue Feather pins which one Trunk one half Cane dressing Table painted red and black, 1 spinning Wheel & reel one looking Glass one side Saddle one large wash pot, one tin box one, one over in hanging from one mirror one set wind mirror, one large wooden jarassuet ring one large dish, one small slate dish, one set plates 1 set cups & saucers three pictures two Bows one coffee Warmer three Secanters ten Humblers one Clock three tin pans Also fifteen hundred pounds of Pork fifty thirty five Barrels of Corn, one Barrel Mace named Flora Also one Barrel Colt about one year old two Black Sows with fourteen Pigs and five yearling Shoats one spotted gilt of the Guinea Breed one Red Cow and one Heifer yearling pale red sided with a white face, the above named articles I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Mary Wright to be disposed of by her in life and death. Also one Negro Man named Joel about twenty two years old during her life or widowhood and at the death or marriage of my beloved Wife Mary Wright the above named Joel to be sold and the proceeds of sale Equally divided between all my children.
- I give and bequeath to my son William D. Wright - one Negro boy named Frederick also one hundred dollars in cash.
- I give and bequeath to my son Anderson D. Wright one Negro girl named Quashy.
- I give and bequeath to my son Charles D. Wright one Negro boy named George.
- I give and bequeath to the lawful heirs of my son Joseph D. Wright one Negro boy named Dick about seven years old. Also two hundred dollars in cash my son Joseph D. Wright to be disposed upon there part of my property.
- I give and bequeath to my son John H. Wright one Negro boy named Henry.
- I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann D. Wright wife of James D. Wright one Negro Girl named Sam to be her and the heirs of her body.
- I give and bequeath to my daughter Emily Wright one Negro Girl named Aggy one Iron Fryer named Minny one white speckled cow and calf, one Bantam and one Feather Bird one under Bed four Counters 4 Red quills one Cornish one sheet 1 Bantam & seven two pillows & covers 1 set foot curtains Also twenty five dollars in cash also twelve Barrels of Corn also four hundred pounds of Pork to her and the lawful heirs of her body.
- I give and bequeath to the heirs of my daughter Elizabeth Anderson John Whetten Anderson and George W. Anderson three hundred dollars in cash.
- I give and bequeath to my daughter Francis M. Wright a Negro boy named Patrick also a child named Scilla about eight months old also one Boy Billy named Prison also one speckled cow and three three yearlings one Bantam one Feather Bird Bantam and pillows one under bed two Counters 2 quills one Cornish one sheet ten set foot curtains one side Saddle and Bridle also thirty dollars in cash also twelve Barrels of Corn and four hundred pounds of Pork this I give to her and the heirs of her body.
- I will that all the negroes that have not been hitherto disposed of in this will be divided into ten lots by three Disinterested men to be appointed by the Superior Court who shall make the division upon oath which lots shall be as near the same value as possible and shall be numbered and given for by my legates or agents and those legates drawing lots of the most value for to those of less value so as to make them equal with the exception of my daughter Maria D. Wright who shall be entitled an equal part by paying to my estate one hundred dollars also my son Anderson D. Wright shall have an equal part on paying to my estate thirty dollars and I will the part of the cattle or lots that falls to the heirs of my daughters to them and the heirs of their body. Given in presence of

Attest *Whitworth* I will that all my property both real and personal not otherwise disposed of in this will shall be sold
 and equally divided amongst my heirs
 Attest *Whitworth* I will that one fourth part of my Estate shall go to the legal heirs of my son Joseph & Wright in the year
 1811 he to be supported as long as he lives out of the proceeds of the same. I hereby appoint my son
 Arthur L. Wright Guardian for the heirs of Joseph & Wright and John Whitman Anderson and
 George W. Anderson,
 Attest *Whitworth* I do hereby will and appoint as my Lawfull Executors my sons Arthur L. Wright and
 John Parham to carry out the various provisions in this my last will and Testament
 Signed and sealed this the twenty sixth day of September One Thousand Eight Hundred and forty nine
 in the presence of *William B. Wright (real)*

 agree & accord with the said William B. Wright that our step mother Mary Wright shall have in her own right the
 following named negroes forever to wit: Betty Ann, a woman and the four children namely Sarah, John, Pender
 & Melis, the said Property last mentioned to the said Mary Wright since the Legates herein named and whose
 names are hereunto subscribed do relinquish all the right and title whatever to said property and do bind ourselves
 to accord with the terms of this obligation in testimony of which we the said Legates have hereunto subscribed
 our names jointly and severally this one hundred and fourth day of September One Thousand Eight Hundred and forty nine
 at Polk County Georgia
