and conscious of the certainty of death have thought proper to make and publish this
my last Will and Testament in form following to wit

I will that my burial expenses and all my just debts be first paid from the proceeds of my Estate
Mary Wright I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife two lots of land Lot number Eight Hundred
and thirty and Lot number Eight Hundred and seventy two both of the Twenty first District of
the Third Section New Pounding County and the use of Twenty acres of blessed land in my Plantation
one year free of Rent. Whomever she may choose. Also Betty Ann a Molatto Girl slave about twenty one
years old. Also her four children named as follows Sarah a Girl about six years old, John James
a boy about four years old. Also Lovidge a Girl about three years old. Willie Thomas a boy about
six months old. Also one Dutch Brod Steer one Feather Bed one under bed. Ten Counties five 4 Bed quilts
down quilts six sheets three stand of curtains one Blue flannel pair sheet one Trunk one Half Cass
dressing Table painted red and black, 1 spinning Wheel & reel one looking Glass one side table one large wash
pot one 3 times set, one over on string from one Spine one set wind Sown, one large wooden japanned tin
one large dish, one small stak dish one set plates 1 set cups & saucers three pictures two Bows one Coffin Wainster
three Decanters ten tumblers one Clock three tin pans Also fifteen Hundred pounds of Pork Also
thirty five Barrels of Corn, one Barrel Wax named Flora Also one Barrel Colt about one year old
two Black Sows with fourteen Pigs and five yearling Steats one spotted gilt of the Guinea Breed
one Red Cow and one Heifer yearling pale red faced with a white face, the above named articles I give
and bequeath to my beloved Wife Mary Wright to be disposed of by her in life and death. Also one Negro Man
named Joel about twenty two years old during her life or widowhood and at the death or marriage of my
beloved Wife Mary Wright the above named Joel to be sold and the proceeds of sale Equally divided
between all my children

I give and bequeath to my son ^{Peck County Will 1848-1891} William D. Wright one Negro boy named Wesley also one Hundred Dollars

I give and bequeath to my son Anderson D. Wright one Negro girl named Quashy

I give and bequeath to my son Walter D. Wright one Negro boy named George

I give and bequeath to the lawful heirs of my son Joseph D. Wright one Negro boy named Dick about seven years
old Also two Hundred Dollars in Cash my son Joseph D. Wright to be disposed upon three part of my property

I give and bequeath to my son John H. Wright one Negro boy named Henry

I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann Betty wife of James H. Betty one Negro Girl named Tom to be her and the heirs of her body

I give and bequeath to my daughter Emily Wright one Negro Girl named Aggy one son my child named Minny
one white speckled cow and calf. One Bedsteer and one Feather Bed one under bed four Counties 4 Bed quilts one
Coverslet one sheet 1 Bedsteer cover two pillows & covers 1 set foot curtains Also twenty five Dollars in Cash also twelve
Barrels of Corn also four Hundred pounds of Pork to her and the lawful heirs of her body

I give and bequeath to the heirs of my daughter Elizabeth Anderson John Whitten Anderson and
George W. Anderson three Hundred Dollars in Cash

I give and bequeath to my daughter Francis M. Wright a Negro boy named Patrick also a Child named
Sella about eight months old also one Boy Billy named Pagan also one speckled cow and three
steers yearlings one Bedsteer one Feather Bed Bedsteer and pillows one under bed two Counties 2 quilts
one Coverslet one sheet three set foot curtains one side table and Briller also thirty Dollars in Cash
also twelve Barrels of Corn and four Hundred pounds of Pork this I give to her and the heirs of her body

I will that all the papers that have not been hitherto disposed of in this will be divided into ten lots by three
Disinterested men to be appointed by the Superior Court who shall make the division upon oath which lots shall
be as near the division as possible and shall be numbered and given for by my legates or agents and those
legates drawing lots of the most value for to those of less value so as to make them equal with the exception
of my daughter Martha's share who shall be entitled an equal part by paying to my estate one
Hundred Dollars also my son Anderson D. Wright shall have an equal part on paying to my estate thirty
Dollars and I will the part parcels or lots that falls to the share of my daughter to them and the heirs of
their body James is for Sells
