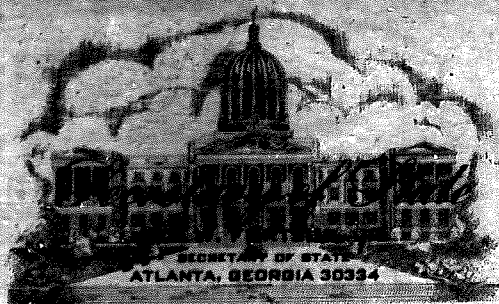

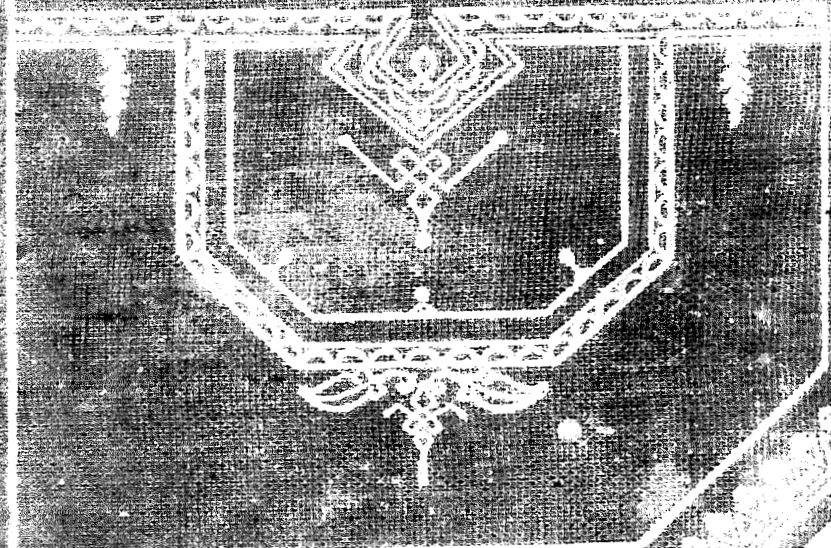

Private, in Co. E 2d Regt G. I. P.
 Mr Bester was born in Wilkes
 County Aug 29th 1876.

Mr Bester moved to Hammondsville
 in the fall of 1910 and on Dec 22
 of that year enlisted in Pulaski
 Volunteers, was a faithful member
 and won the esteem & love of all

In February 1901. Mr Bester was
