

Codicil to Prier Gauthier's last will and Testament

- 1st It is further my will and Testament desired that should the tract of land which I have devised to be sold for the benefit of my daughters not bring an amount sufficient to give each of my said daughters an amount equal to what Henry, Elv. & Fred. B. G. shall receive from the sale of the land devised to be sold for their benefit that such deficiency shall be made up to them out of my Estate — So that the share of my said daughters from the land shall be equal to the share of my said sons respectively out of their land
- 2nd It is my will and intention that in the event of the death of any negro bequeathed to either of my children before the same shall have been received by them, that the value of such negro shall be made up out of to such child out of my Estate upon the general division, In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 11th day of January 1823

The last Will and Testament of Adam Manning dec'd

In the name of God Amen
I Adam Manning, of the County of Putnam and State of Georgia being sound of mind full memory but in the decline of life knowing that it is appointed for men to die and being it a duty as well as necessary to set in order such matters and things as God connected me with before I lay this mortality down, Do make constitute and ordain this my last will and testament, in the manner and form following
My will is that all my just debts be paid

The Last Will and Testament of Adam Manning 1824

- Item 1st I Give my beloved wife Mary Manning on half of my land and plantation where I now live joining Thomas Sparks, John Hamilton and Asa Hearn. one negro woman named Sarah and child Lot and woman and her negrow man named Bob. one feather bed and furniture during her natural life or widow hood. And my will is that James Saterwhite my son in law and David Saterwhite his father chorment of the rest of my personal Estate of every description or kind as much as they shall think completely and fully sufficient for the support and use of my wife Mary Manning on said plantation during her natural life or widow hood.
- Item 2nd At my death I give to my son Isaac Manning one negro boy named Stee. one thousand one and one quarter acres of land in the lower corner of my Land joining Thomas Wilbourn, and Benjamin Moody one feather bed and furniture.
- 3rd At my death I give to my son Littleton Manning one negro man named Sam one thousand one and one quarter acres of land joining Thomas Wilbourn and Benjamin Hearn.
- 4th At my death I give to my son William B Manning one negro girl named Linn on feather bed and furniture and at the death or marriage of my wife Mary Manning one hundred one and one quarter acres of land joining Thomas Sparks and John Hamilton also eighty dollars in cash of the sale of my Estate.
- 5th At my death I give to my son John B Manning one negro girl named Harriet at the death of my wife Mary Manning or widow hood one hundred one and one quarter acres of land joining Asa Hearn and cornering with Thomas Hall and Gutter Red and furniture and eighty dollars in cash out of the sale of my Estate, I have no right to his married life or children.
- 6th At my death I give to my daughter Patsy Hall one negro girl named Rose.
- 7th At my death I give to my daughter Betsey Saterwhite one negro girl named Sally or Sarah.
- 8th At my death I give to my daughter Nancy Allen one negro girl named Stella.
- 9th At my death I give to my daughter Rebekah Saterwhite one negro boy named Harry.
- 10th At my death I give to my daughter Polly Hall one negro named Venus.
- 11th At the death or marriage of my wife Mary Manning I give to my grand daughter Polly Allen one negro boy named Lot.

12th All the Balance of my property Estate not herein mentioned and mitted at my death to be sold and all lent to my wife her lifetime or widowhood not given away afterwards by me at the death or marriage to be sold and its future increase and after all my debts are paid and legacies made out the balance to be equally divided among all my children

13th I nominate and appoint constitute and appoint my son Isaac Manning and Thomas Ball my only and sole Executors of this my last will and Testament, revoking disannulling and disallowing all other will or wills heretofore made by me at any time, In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the 29th day of October in the year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred and thirty three Signed Sealed and acknowledged
