mind do first of all recommend my soul to god who made
It and my body to be buried in a Christian like manner
at the discretion of my Executors. I do hereby nominate authorize
and appoint my beloved wife Rebecca Arreca and John Arreca
to be the Executors of my last will and testament and
intrusting all worldly affairs which it has been pleases god to
bless me with that is to say after all my lawfull debts
are paid

Item 1st I give to my two grand children Polly Haggard & Ann Haggard one
dollar each with what their mother has Received hereof
and that to be paid of their part

Item 2nd I give my daughter Elizabeth what she has Received hereof

Item 3rd I give my daughter Fanny Newman what she has Received hereof

Item 4th I give my son Bradley what he has Received hereof

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Arreca one Negro boy
named Jack one hundred dollars in cash one cow half and one bed
and furniture

Item 6th I give and bequeath to daughter Cornelia one cow half one bed
and furniture and also one Negro Woman named Wanny at the
death of my beloved wife

Item 7th I give and bequeath to my daughter Eady one Negro boy named
Hester one cow and calf and one bed and furniture

Item 8th I give and bequeath to my daughter Cynthia one Negro boy named
Melton one cow and calf one bed and furniture

Item 9 I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally one Negro Girl named
Harriet one cow and calf one bed and furniture

Item 10 I give and bequeath to my beloved wife my land whereon
I now live and all the remainder of my property during her
life and at her death all to be sold and the John Arreca
Bradley Arreca and Thomas Newman to Receive from the sale
one hundred and fifty dollars each then the remainder
to be equally divided between all my surviving children
