In the name of God. Amen
I Charles Denham of the state and County
aforesaid being of perfect and sound memory
mind and judgement do make and ordain publish and be-
-are this instrument of writing for and as my last will and tes-
-tament of and concerning touching all such property both real
and personal as I may be in possession of hold claim or may
be entitled unto in any manner whatsoever at the time of my death
1st Item I will and hereby order and direct that all my just debts
be paid first and that as expeditiously as may be in the power of my
executors. 2nd Item I hereby name all my lawful heirs my wife
Nancy Denham, my sons David Denham, Daniel Denham
John Denham, James Denham, John Denham and my
daughters Elizabeth Denham, Fennella Denham, Mary Denham
Abigail Denham and should my wife Nancy Denham have
him that is unborn that is agreeable to law I shall share an equal
in my estate with all my heirs above named.

3rd Item My wish is that all my property be kept together so
far as will be sufficient to pay, support and educate my child-
-ren according to the situation of my estate my executors to
have such property appointed and give off to any of my children
that may marry or become of age or may have become of age
at the estate is able to spare or not surpassing the proportion
part they are to have according to the situation of the estate. the
executors to point out any property the estate is best able to spare.
the general division of my estate is not to take place until the
death or marriage of my wife Nancy Denham or the youngest child
become of age and which shall first happen.

4th Item My will is that all of my heirs before named have

equal part in my estate and should it be thought proper by my executors to dispose of my property for the better situation of my family they shall have the full power to sell any property off my estate and make titles, buy any property, receive titles for the benefit of my family.

Item 5th My will is that my wife Nancy Denham and her children have at the general division of my estate two negroes Anthony and Lora and in case which negroes are to be valued and to be as a part of their legacy the other heirs to be made equal in the other property. 5th Item I do hereby make constitute and ordain John A. Cogburn my executor and my wife Nancy Denham my executrix of this my last will and testament and I do hereby disavow, revoke and disannul all and every other former testament, will, legacy Bequests and executors by me in any way by me before made and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament; in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day of July in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and twenty eight.
