case she should not marry it is my wish after her decease
that Henry Allen Coleman have the whole of it both real
& personal. I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved
wife Mary & Allen Coleman and William E. Adams Executors of
this my last will and testament in testimony whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal this 30th
day of June 1825

buried in decent Christianlike manner and as to the
worldly concerns which I am possessed of I will in the
following manner to wit:
1st It is my will and desire that my wife be first paid

I will that my daughter Louise B. Lawson have my
Negro man Will exclusive of an equal share of the remainder
of my estate. And I will that my daughter Amelia
Porter have my old negro woman Lacey to take care of and my
silver table spoons to her and her heirs together with an equal
share of my estate that remains to be managed by my son
Thaddeus B. Russ a trustee for my daughter and her children
And I will that my son Thaddeus B. Russ have my negro
man Dick and account to the my children for four
hundred dollars at the general division of my estate.
4th I will that my daughter Elizabeth Swanson have my old
silver tea spoons with an equal share of my estate.
5th I will that my daughter Folly have my bed curtains and
thirty dollars with an equal share. I will my daughter
Elyza one Calico Counterpane & thirty dollars with an equal
share of my estate. I will that my daughter Elsie B. have my
bay mare and saddle and curtain bedstead and little table
and China ware and new silver tea spoons and an equal
share of my estate.

I will my executor to sell my negroes on a credit of twelve
months. I will that a bed and furniture be kept by my
daughter B. Lawson for the use of son A. F. Russ family
and his share of my estate I will to be controlled by my son
Thad B. Russ solely for the use of my son A. F. Russ and his
family and not to be subject to the payment of any claims
against the said A. F. Russ.

Last - it is my will that after first taking out the legacies
contained in the will that all my children are to share share
and share alike as the all their names are mentioned except
my son John Russ who has drawn out of his fathers estate
before this more than is coming to any child in part
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 10th day
of June 1829. Lastly I nominate and appoint my son

Thad B. Russ my executor who is authorized to use his own discretion
in the sale of all my property of every description and to do any
thing that will accord with the true intent and meaning of
this my last will and testament. in Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal in presence of the day and
date before mentioned.
