Item 1st I know all men by their parents, that Elizabeth Holland
Putnam County 3 and of State and County aforesaid. Knowing that it is appropriate
and including such to in and being of sound and perfect mind as make this
my last will & testament in the manner and form following to wit
Item 1st My body to be decently buried and all my just debts to be paid then and there
and bequeath unto Sarah C. Wyman, William C. Wyman, Gabriel Wyman
being Children of Thomas Wyman of Putnam County formerly Orange Holland
now living in the County of Essex and State aforesaid the following my
own Goods, Cattle & Household, It is my desire that if either of the
above named Children die intestate that the negroes left them be ^{intestate} the
property of the living Children in reference to the Children deceased
it is understood that if either of them die without an heir or heirs that
the property left them become the living ones property, my land to be sold
and the proceeds of my property not herebefore named nor hereafter named
are to be sold and the money arising therefrom to be a proportionate payment
of my debts and all the Tax & due hereafter named to be paid and
the remainder to go to the above named Children Item 2nd I give and bequeath
unto Caroline H. Holland now living with me two negroes viz. Pigeon
one bed of furniture one cow and calf to her and her heirs forever Item 3rd
I give unto Martha M. Hall now living with me one negro girl by the name of
Frankly one cow & calf to her and her heirs forever Item 4th I give
and bequeath unto Joyce T. Hall now living with me two hundred dollars
to be paid in money as the money can be collected to her & her heirs forever
Item 5th I give and bequeath unto Polly T. my wife of Jackson Twp one cow
and calf to her & her heirs forever Item 6th I give and bequeath unto
Henna B. Hall now living in Putnam the large front dish and
large front Basin Item 7th I give and bequeath unto Sarah M.
Wife of Thomas Wyman of Putnam County 3 a box of my household and
kitchen furniture in Putnam I think proper to take not above named
the remainder to be sold I hereby appoint John H. Basso of Putnam
County aforesaid sole Executor to this my last will & testament this the 1st
April 1831
in presence of Wm. Hart, Hamlin Bess, Elizabeth Holland & 2
Nathan Bess

Georgia In the name of God Amen
Putnam County I, William Flournoy a citizen of the County & State aforesaid
being of sound and disposing mind and memory but weak in bodily health and
well knowing the uncertainty of this life and the certainty of death do make and
make this instrument to be my last will and testament in manner and form
following (viz) First I commend and commend my soul into the care of him
who gave it - and after death I wish my body buried in a decent Christian manner
and as to the worldly part which I own own I give and bequeath in manner and
form following (to wit) I do set it is my will and desire that my Executors
herein after named should first pay all my just debts. Then I do give
and bequeath unto my beloved son William B. Flournoy the following negro
to wit, Dennis and his wife Lucy and all their children namely James
Anthony Pleasant Charles Jacob and a child whose name I do not mention
Charles and his wife Rose and all their children namely Fisher Hilliard Nelson
and two other children names not mentioned Jacob and his children namely
Peter Elijah Thomas Martha & Mary and a child name not mentioned
I do give to my said son William B. Flournoy and his heirs and assigns and it is my will and
desire that if any of the negro women herein before mentioned and given unto my said
William B. Flournoy shall have or be the mother of any other child or children (born
ing or coming at the time that the said child or children shall be born) and be the
property of my said son William B. Flournoy and I do give and bequeath unto
my said William B. Flournoy the several tracts of land including my present residence
which I own in the County aforesaid adjoining the town of Columbus, Ga. I do give
and bequeath unto my said son William B. Flournoy and his heirs and assigns all the land I own in the said County with all of the stock
of horses, Cows, Hogs &c. which has been usually kept on said plantation
with all the plantation tools, negroes, carts, oxen and every other thing usually
kept on said plantation except as is herein after excepted I do give and
bequeath unto my said son William B. Flournoy fifty shares of stock which I
own in the Bank of the State of Georgia on which I have paid
in cash thereon one hundred dollars and also fifty four shares of stock
which I own in the Bank of Georgia on which I have
paid fifty five dollars on each share
