

Francis Scotts Will

Georgia } In the name of God amen, I Francis Scott
Putnam County } of the County and State aforesaid being in
a low state of health but of sound and disposing mind
and memory and being desirous of settling my worldly affairs
while I have strength and capacity so to do, do make
and publish this my last will and testament and first
and principally of all I Commit my soul into the hands
of my Creator who gave it and my body to the earth to
be buried at the discretion of my executors hereinafter
named, and as to such worldly estate wherewith it hath
pleased God to interest me I dispose of the same as followeth
1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Charity
Scott all my land wherupon I now live for her own proper use
and benefit during her natural life and at her death the
said land is to belong to my grandson Francis Scott I
also give unto my wife all my household & kitchen furniture
during her life and as much of my stock as she may think
she will need for her comfortable support after all my
just debts are paid out of the same and at her death
the said personal property all to be sold and the proceeds
thereof to be equally divided (except the property she had when
we married) between my son Stephen P Scott and
daughter Martha P Scott
2nd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Jane Wright
one dollar to be paid out of my estate
3rd I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Lucency
Wright one dollar to be paid out of my estate
4th I give and bequeath unto my wife Daughter Femina
P Scott one dollar to be paid out of my estate
5th I give and bequeath unto my son Stephen P Scott
one small bull

I appoint my son Stephen P Scott and my son
-in-law John M Scott my executors to this my last will
and testament hereby revoking all former wills of mine
whereof I have herunto set my hand and seal this 6th
day of July 1822 thousand eight hundred and twenty two
