I knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do make this
my last will & testament - revoking all others heretofore made by me
1st I give and bequeath unto my wife I am a certain negro woman
by the name of Betty to do with as she thinks proper all or part of
even I cast and her choice of head out of my stock & also I leave
her choice of head of sheep one dozen hogs such as she chooses two beds
and furniture the rest of the household furniture the taken furniture and
plantation tools I want my wife I am to have whatever she and my
son Archibald thinks she needs all of which property at the death of my
wife is to return to my heirs except the negro woman Betty
2nd I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel two negroes Amy & Lett
by his paying unto the rest of my heirs one hundred and fifty dollars
3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Eliza McTate a
negro girl by the name of Dinah which negro girl is to
return back to the rest of my children if Abigail dies without
any issue my daughter Eliza is to have three hundred dollars
left then my other children which is the worth of the negro girl
Dinah out of my other property
4th It is my wish and desire that the rest of my property not
heretofore named should be equally divided among my heirs i.e.
Archibald, Samuel, Abigail, Nancy, Mary and my grandson
Green Turner if any of the above named heirs die without issue
their part is to return back to be divided among the rest of my
heirs. 5th I want my land and all the rest of my property not
heretofore named to be sold by my executor in order to make the
division heretofore named. Lastly I do hereby nominate and
appoint my son Archibald my executor to this my last will and
testament. I also wish my son Archibald also to have the control
of my grandson part Green Turner to sell or to clothe or any

other necessary expenses which Archibald Turner will be become of age in limited whereof I have hereto set my hand and seal this thirteenth day of April 1826.

Charles Denham's Will

State of Georgia

In the name of God, Amen
I, Charles Denham of the state and County aforesaid being of perfect and sound memory mind and judgement do make and ordain publish and declare this instrument of writing for and as my last will and testament of and concerning touching all such property both real and personal as I may be in possession of hold claim or may be entitled unto in any manner whatsoever at the time of my death
1st Item I will and hereby order and direct that all my just debts be paid first and that as expeditiously as may be in the power of my executors.
2nd Item I hereby name all my lawful heirs my wife Nancy Denham, my sons David Denham, Daniel Denham, John Denham, James Denham, Sarah Denham and my daughters Elizabeth Denham, Fimelia Denham, Mary Denham, Rebecca Denham and should my wife Nancy Denham have a heir that is unborn that is agreeable to law it shall then be agreed in my estate with all my heirs above named.
3rd Item My wish is that all my property be kept together so far as will be sufficient to raise support and educate my children according to the situation of my estate my executors to have such property appointed and given off to any of my children that may marry or become of age or may have become of age as the estate is able to spare or not surpassing the supposed part they are to have according to the situation of the estate. the executors to point out any property the estate is best able to spare. the general division of my estate is not to take place until the death or marriage of my wife Nancy Denham or the youngest child becomes of age and which shall first happen.
4th Item My will is that all of my heirs before named have
