purchasers of the same and the proceeds of said property both real & personal as

is to be hereunto understood that my Brother Francis is to be excepted and to ac-
-cuse not part whatever of my estate, I do hereby nominate and appoint
Green Perry Exec. to this my last will and testament in testimony of which
