With a view to dispose of my property while in the enjoyment of the health and sound exercise of my mind I do hereby make this my last will and testament My first wish and direction is that all my just debts be paid.
 2^d That two of my best beds and bedstead with suitable furniture be each be given one to my son Jacob Pennekot and the other to my daughter Sarah C. Pettit.
 3^d It is further my will that twenty my woman about forty or fifty years old and kept about twelve years old be both given to my son John W. Pennekot.
 4th It is further my will that fifty my woman about twenty five years old and William about seven years old be given to my daughter Elyse C. Reed and to the care of her boy. I give also to my daughter Elyse C. Reed my chest of drawers.
 5th It is further my will that every thing else I own herein the property specified be equally divided between my son John W. Pennekot and my daughter Elyse C. Reed, after my death I wish this my last will to be executed by my son John W. Pennekot & my son in law William Reed who I hereby appoint my Executors.

Georgia Putnam County } In the name of God, Amen. I, John Little do make this my last will and testament this fourth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty one. It is my desire that after my death my body should be decently buried from the Churchyard near to my beloved Wife Ruth Little and my dear son R. Little a certain negro man by the name of Thomas, a boy by the name of David and a negro woman by the name of Sophia & her children together with all the balance of my property, consisting of land, stock household and kitchen furnished to them to have and to hold forever, Item I do give and bequeath to my two oldest sons Leonard Little & William Little a certain negro woman by the name of old Jerry, one by the name of Nancy, one by the name of Phoebe a negro boy by the name of Lewis a negro girl by the name of Little Jerry, a negro boy by the name of Peter & a negro girl by the name of Phoebe to them to have and to hold forever. Item I do give the property that I expect to get from my fathers estate together with all the note due me to be equally divided between my Wife & her children. I do nominate and appoint Richard Johnson, Zachariah Proffittson & Robert Little Executors to this my last will and testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 4th day of April 1831 in presence of J. H. Jackson & J. H. Hill J.P.

one bed of furniture one cow and calf to her and her heirs forever Item 3rd
I give unto Martha Wall now living with me one negro girl by the name of
Franky one cow & calf to her and her heirs forever Item 4th I give
and bequeath unto Jozeph F. Spain now living with me two hundred dollars
to be paid in money to the money can be collected to her & her heirs forever
Item 5th I give and bequeath unto Mary F. Spain one cow
and calf to her & her heirs forever Item 6th I give and bequeath unto
Bena Bunch now living in Putnam the large piano and
large piano Bed - Item 8th I give and bequeath unto John H.
Wynn of Putnam County - the whole of my household and
kitchen furniture as the same may think proper to take not alone name
the remainder to be sold I hereby appoint John H. Bunch of Putnam
County aforesaid sole Executor to this my last Testament this 1st
April 1831
