I do hereby nominate and appoint my son Seland Allen my Executor of this my last Will & Testament given under my hand and seal this twenty seventh day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight Hundred & twenty seven

# John Wynn's Will

Georgia  
Putnam County  
I John Wynn of the County & State  
aforesaid being Mente & Body but sound  
in mind & memory, do make & ordain this instrument  
of Writing to be my last Will & Testament, for the distribution  
and management of my property & effects, as follows (viz)  
1<sup>st</sup> I will after my death & my Body decently buried in a  
Christian like Manner & the Expence thereof paid out of  
my Estate  
2<sup>nd</sup> I will that all my just debts be paid out of any  
Money belonging to my estate  
3<sup>rd</sup> I will that all my property, (viz) my land whereon  
I now live, all my negroes (namely) Andy a man  
Anthony a man, Bob a Boy, Corney a Woman, Eliza  
a Woman, Judy a woman & her Child Milly, Ann a  
woman & her four Children, Alley, Rachel, Philip & Rose  
together with all my House hold & Kitchen Furniture, all  
my Crops, Plantation tools & Stocks of every kind together  
with every thing else that does or may belong to my Estate  
be kept together, on my plantation in one common Stock  
so long as my beloved wife Mary may live & remain  
single & use for the support of my beloved wife aforesaid  
& all my Children, namely Robert J. Wynn, Greenham  
Wynn, John J. Wynn, Martha A. Wynn, William J. Wynn  
Mary J. Wynn, & James A. Wynn & also for the Education  
of my Children aforesaid but should my beloved wife Mary

I will to her One hundred Dollars in Money and all the balance to my Children aforesaid to ~~retain~~ in one Common Stock untill any one of the Girls shall marry or one of the Boys arrive at the age of twenty one Years, Then when either of the girls shall marry or ~~become~~ <sup>arrive</sup> at the age of twenty one Years or the Boys become twenty one Year old, they are at Liberty to draw from my Estate a proportionable part of my property aforesaid as his or her distributive share of my said Estate and the Balance still kept together in one Common Stock and distributed as above untill all my Children shall either marry or become twenty one Year old as above, And I hereby nominate & appoint my friend Thomas Johnston Executor in the foregoing Will & Testament with discretionary power to sell any Surplus production of my farm, or any thing else necessary to be sold and apply the proceeds thereof to the best interests of my family aforesaid. Harwell being in sound mind and knowing the uncertainty of life & the certainty of death make this my last Will & Testament revoking all others if any by me made, I do will & bequeath unto my affectionate Father Anderson Harwell my Negro Boy Mitty to him and his heirs for ever and that my Girl Harriet by him the said Anderson Harwell as he may think most advantageous and the same applied to the payment of my just debts and that the said A. Harwell have and take charge of all my notes & papers and attend to the payment of debt and all the interest I may have of any Value whatever I appoint the same Anderson Harwell my only Executor to put this my last Will & Testament in to effect
