marry or become of age if neither of my said grand children
shall live to the happening and fulfilling of the time appointed for
payment of the said two hundred dollars then and in that case
the said two hundred dollars shall rest in and become permanently
the property of my son William, the use and interest of which until
the aforesaid appointed time of payment, I give to him my said
son William Thirdly - I give and bequeath to my four grand
sons Lucius Francis William and Josiah Williams children of my
son John Williams my tract of land in Henry County and state of Georgia
containing two hundred two and a half acres which my son

Lastly I appoint my daughter Chloe Williamson executrix to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills by me at any time heretofore made and ratifying and confirming this, I have in testimony whereof hereunto set my hand by making my mark and affixed my seal this tenth day of February eighteen hundred and twenty seven.
