In the name of God Amen I Outrick
Dickey being of sound mind & memory
But considerably advanced in years and in a low state of
health, and knowing it is appointed for all men once to
die. Do make and ordain this my last will and testament
hereby revoking and repealing all other wills bequests or
disposes whatsoever, Item the first it is my will that my
plantation on which I now live with the track of Land
and premises it being number One hundred & forty five
in the tenth district of Originally Baldwin but now
Putnam County, containing two hundred & two & half
acres and Eight Negroes (viz) Clov, Charity, Ellick,
George, Amos, Charles, Leason, Hannah and Sam.
together with the whole of my stock of Horses, Cattle
and Hogs, One Wagon and two Cows and all my plantation
tools One Still and Appurtenances my house hold & kitchen
furniture of every description and any and all other of
my effects that I now have or may have at the time
of my death, shall remain in possession of my wife
Sarah Dickey during of her natural life or widowhood
and provided my said wife Sarah should intermarry
at any time after my death it is my will that she shall
retain during her life one negro woman name Clov
one horse one cow & half one feather Bed & furniture
and my house hold & kitchen furniture
Item second I give to my son Joseph Dickey one note of
hand which my said son made payable to me for one
hundred Dollars due the 1st January 1822 Said Note
dated 15th July 1820 and no more
Item third I give to my son Samuel Dickey one hundred
Dollars to be paid him by my Executors after the sale
of my property
Item the fourth I leave to my daughter Elizabeth Larver
during her life and give to the lawful heirs of her body
Five hundred Dollars to be paid by my Executors after the sale
of my property as aforesaid

Item Fifth I give to my son Andrew Dickey One Negro Boy named Sam and three hundred Dollars to be paid by my Executors as aforesaid

Item Sixth I give to my son Robert Dickey Two Negroes namely Eliza a man and Anica a woman but not until the death or intermarriage of my wife as aforesaid

Item Seventh I give to my son John Dickey two Negroes namely George and Asador to be received by him at the same time as stated in the foregoing Item

Item Eighth I leave to my daughter Jane Green during her life and after her death give to the lawful heirs of her body One negro woman named Charity at the same time as stated above

Item Ninth I leave to my daughter Rebecca Smith during her life and after her death give to the lawful heirs of her body a negro girl by the name of Hannah to be received at the same time as stated in the sixth Item of this will

Item Tenth It is my will that as soon as expedient after the death or intermarriage of my said wife Sarah Dickey my Executors proceed to sell on a credit of Twelve months

My Land Horses, Cattle, Hogs, and Stock of every kind Plantation tools and property of every other description that may then belong to my Estate Except such as I have given away

in the Sixth, Seventh, Eighth, & Ninth Items of this will also after the payment of One hundred Dollars to my son Samuel

and Two Hundred to my daughter Elizabeth and her heirs to my son Andrew Two hundred Dollars as before stated in this will out of the proceeds of the aforesaid sales the balance

I wish to be Equally divided then & there alike between my sons Andrew Robert and Owen and my daughters Elizabeth Jane and Rebecca

Item Eleventh I hereby ordain constitute and appoint my wife Sarah Dickey Executrix and my sons Robert and Owen my Executors to carry into effect this my last Will with full power to

execute all and every part thereof as thus directed in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the thirtieth of July in the year of our Lord 1825
