Item 5th I give to my Daughter Mary Stinson My Walnut folding Table Cloth & Bed Sheet. Item 6th I give to my grand daughter Martha Ann Matilda Stinson two hundred dollars. Item 7th It is my will and desire that all the property that I have which I have not specifically disposed of be sold and the above Money Legacies paid off and the remainder of any be equally divided between my surviving Children and their heirs. I appoint My Sons John & Zachariah Edmondson John Henson My Executors May 23rd 1826. Signed in the presence of Zachariah Edmondson and Margaret Halladay.

Lee of the State and County aforesaid being in a low state of health - but of perfect and sound Memory, sound and indyement do make certain public and declare this instrument of Writing for and as my Last Will and Testament of and Concerning and bequeath all such property as I may be possessed of both Claim or may be entitled to in any manner or way, whether at the time of my decease Item 1st I will & hereby order and direct that all my Just Debts be paid and all good as it may be in the power of my Executors Item 2nd It is my Will that my Executors at this directed do sell all much of my property as will pay off all demands or just debts against me Item 3rd It is my desire that my beloved wife Elizabeth A. Lee do keep all my property that is left after paying

My debts in the possession to raise my children and educate them as well as the circumstances will admit of but if the child is poor to marry a second time it is my Will & I do desire that all my landed property personal and all my other property of any description be sold to the highest bidder at the direction of my Executors and the money arising from such sale to be equally divided between my children but that the Custom and Widow's Dower should remain to her and the property to be sold to the highest bidder and the money arising from said sale to be equally divided between my children as aforesaid. Item I do desire that my Will be read and that the said my Executors be authorized and directed to sell the Land and premises which I now live and journey - a Settlement for my family in the neighborhood in which they would wish to live and also my Will. My friend Mr. John Dally and have authorized to sell any piece of property - belonging to me if he thinks it is to their benefit and to purchase such property as they may stand in need of. I wish my money when I constitute make a will to be my sole Executor of the my last Will and testament & I hereby do utterly disavow and disannul all and every other former Testaments Wills Letters Request & Executors by me in any way before named Wills & bequeaths making any reference thereto or to be my last Will & Testament.
