aforesaid being old and infirm in body but of sound mind
and memory do make and devise this my last will
and testament as follows to wit I bequeath I leave unto

Stipendiary and also an Ager Command named Benjamin to my
beloved Son Eliza Hearn and after his death the said Benjamin
and her income to be equally divided between my beloved

assigns forever
It is my will and desire is that my Executors do make
payment to the State of Eliza Hearn for and the amount
of Six hundred thirty one dollars and of the surplus make
an equal division between themselves to them and their heirs
and assigns forever

like manner and my worldly goods as follows

- 1 I Give and bequeath to my son Pattle Smith one Negro Man
named our negro boy called to him and his heirs forever
- 2 I Give and bequeath to my daughter Charlotte one Negro
Woman called if she should have any married from
this time before my death I Give and bequeath the same
to my son Pattle and his heirs forever
- 3 I Give and bequeath to my son Thomas Smith one Negro
boy named Edmund to him and his heirs forever, I also give
and bequeath to my son Joel Smith one Negro Girl
named Ester also one pretty head and furniture to him
and his heirs forever, I hereby nominate and appoint
my son in law John Hearn the sole Executor of this my
last will and Testament hereby disavowing all other
wills bequeaths or gifts by me made and confirming
this and no other to be my last will and Testament
