

Robert Killebrew's Will

In the name of God, Amen

I Robert Killebrew of the State of Georgia and Putnam County now labouring under bodily infirmity but sound in mind and memory (thanks be to God for the same) and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed that all that all born must die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have signed my name and seal at the place above written this 18th day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven.

I commend my soul into the hands of God who gave it; my body to its original dust; and whosoever touching such worldly goods as I have pleased God to bless me in this life, it is my will and desire that it be disposed of in the manner and form following. 1st it is my will and desire that all the property that I possess at my death shall be kept together as a common stock for the education and support of my Children untill my youngest Child be come of lawful age or married subject to the following division as I have given my daughter Harriet of one Bess and furniture, one cow and calf (with some other articles estimated at three dollars and fifty cents) this also my will that each of my Children should receive the like sum when they be come of lawful age or married to make their parts equal; and it is also my will and desire that my Children, namely James, Susan, Robert and Pleasant have two years schooling at some approved English School and it is further my will and desire that when my youngest Child be come of lawful age or married that all the estate or property then left or not remaining with or all emoluments arising therefrom be equally divided amongst my Children or their heirs in such manner and form as my Executors may think most convenient to the benefit and interest of my Legatee and estate. I do further more constitute and appoint Peyton Holt and William C. Thomas Executors to this my last will and testament nothing all other heretofore made or said to be made by me in testimony of which I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this nineteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven.
