I Give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Gray my lands
and all my negroes & stock of every description plantation tools
Household and Kitchen Furniture with the Residue of my
property during her natural life time After her death I
want my property distributed in the following manner viz
I Give and bequeath to my son John Gray my negro man Peter
I Give and bequeath to my son Thomas Gray my negro
Woman Dicky & a boy a girl and a boy by the name of John
and my 1/2 of the Oxen and Cows I Give and bequeath unto my
daughter Elizabeth William a negro boy named Isaac which I
Gave off to her at her marriage I Give and bequeath unto my
daughter Nancy Thomas a negro girl named Nancy which I gave
her marriage I Give and bequeath to my son William
Gray my negro man Stephen & a boy named Peter my lands
belonging unto me between my son Thomas William Gray
with the Residue of my property I leave my son Thomas
William Gray my lawful Executors in testimony whereof
I have affixed my hand and seal this 26th day of Decem-
ber in the year 1825

Micajah White's Will

In the name of God Amen

I Micajah White of the State of Georgia and County of
Putnam being Males of body full sound of mind and memory
do make this my last Will and testament, dated June 24th
1826 the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred twenty six
and forty ninth year of American Independence

1 I will that my Just debts be paid first.
2 I will that my beloved wife keep the land plantation and the
land I own in 16th May 1826 and plantation tools House
Holds and kitchen Furniture, Mares, Cattle, Hogs, Sheep and
poultry also the Negroes namely Harry, Dick, Liza, Polly, Abby
Fanny, Hannah, Clary, Fannie, Charity and Easter and all debts
due me and property or money belonging or belonging to me by
Marriage or otherwise to be kept together for the maintenance
of my wife and children and to give my children their
Education

3 I will that my Executors have full power to sell and
convey my land for any part thereof or Negroes or
any other part of my property that they and my beloved wife may
think for the benefit of my beloved wife children and to purchase
land or Negroes or other property as the interest of my heirs may
require and take titles to or make them and the same to be
valued in law as though I made or received them in my
lifetime.
