In the name of God Amen I Thomas Kimbrough son of the County & State aforesaid being weak in body, but sound in mind and memory revoking all former wills do make this my last will and testament. First of all I desire that my body after my decease may be committed to the mother dust - and resign my soul into the hands of God that gave it. - I leave to my beloved wife Francis Kimbrough, during her natural life, all my Estate both real and personal - and after her decease it is my desire that Bradley Kimbrough son of Wm Kimbrough dec'd should have the Tract of land on which my House stands containing One Hundred Ninety two & one half acres - It is also my desire after her decease that Thomas H Whulas Green County have the balance of my real Estate. But that his Mother Nancy Whulas if she is a longer lived than my wife have the use of it during her life - I also give and bequeath to my nephew Thomas Kimbrough son of Wm Kimbrough, Anthony and Mary and all their Children, and increase - It is also my desire that James Shaughter son of Wm Shaughter dec'd have, after the death of my wife my negro man Green - I also give and bequeath to my nephew Thomas Kimbrough of Putnam County Charles and Julia and all their Children and increase. On condition that he the said Thos advance the sum of Five Hundred Dollars in payment on the last note that Alex. Rude has on me which falls due the first of the Year 1827 I give and bequeath all the balance of my Estate to my beloved wife Francis Kimbrough to dispose of as she may think proper at or before her decease I nominate and appoint my beloved wife Francis Kimbrough together with my nephew Thos Kimbrough of Putnam County & Thos Kimbrough of Green County Executors to this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal this 16th day of May A.D. 1825

Patrick Dickey Will

Georgia
Putnam County
In the name of God Amen I Patrick
Dickey being of sound mind & memory
But considerably advanced in years and in a low state of
health, and knowing it is appointed for all men once to
die. do make and ordain this my last will and testament
hereby revoking and repealing all other wills bequests or
dismisses whatsoever. Item the first it is my will that my
plantation on which I now live with the track of Land
and premises it being number One hundred & forty five
in the tenth district of originally Baldwin but now
Putnam County, containing two hundred & two half
acres and eight Negroes (viz) Eliza, Charity, Eliza,
George, Amos, Charles, Leason, Hannah and Sam.
together with the whole of my stock of Horses, cattle
and Hogs, One wagon and Car and all my plantation
tools one still and apparatus, my house hold & kitchen
furniture of every description and any and all other of
my effects that I now have or may have at the time
of my death, shall remain in possession of my wife
Sarah Dickey during of her natural life or widowhood
and provided my said wife Sarah should intermarry
at any time after my death it is my will that she shall
retain during her life one negro woman name Eliza
one horse one cow & half one feather Bed & furniture
and my house hold & kitchen furniture
Item second I give to my son Joseph Dickey one note of
hand which my said son made payable to me for one
hundred Dollar due the 1st January 1822 Said Note
dated 1st July 1820 and no more
Item third I give to my son Samuel Dickey one hundred
Dollar to be paid him by my Executor after the sale
of my property
Item the fourth I leave to my daughter Elizabeth Sever
during her life and give to the lawful heirs of her body
Five hundred Dollar to be paid by my executor after the sale
of my property as aforesaid
