

# ~~Stephen~~ Roby's Will

Georgia  
 Putnam County

In the name of God Amen I ~~Stephen~~ Roby  
 of the County of Putnam aforesaid being law & inform  
 in body, of sound and disposing mind and memory  
 do make and give this my last will and Testament.  
 As follows (to wit)

I bequeath unto my beloved wife Anna Roby  
 the plantation and land whereon I live with her choice  
 of four Negroes out of all I now own, an her choice  
 of the three horses, and four cows & calves and farming  
 tools of all kinds, three beds and furniture during  
 her widowhood.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I give and bequeath unto my beloved sons  
 Williamson Roby and Richard Roby one tract of  
 Land containing three hundred Acres in Jasper County  
 whereon my son Williamson now lives, to be equally  
 divided, or for Williamson to pay Richard four  
 hundred Dollars, or my Executors to collect that  
 amount from Williamson, for Richard. I also leave  
 to my son Richard one half Lot of Land lying in Pike  
 County formerly the 1<sup>st</sup> Dist. of Monroe N. 155. to them  
 and their heirs for ever

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give and bequeath unto my beloved son  
 Robert Roby one lot of land lying in Matton County  
 containing two hundred fifty Acres, known by N. 129. in  
 the 2<sup>nd</sup> District of the County, aforesaid to him and his  
 heirs forever

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath unto my beloved sons  
 Malachi Roby and George St. Roby one lot of land in  
 Hebersham County N. 189. in the 12<sup>th</sup> Dist. of said  
 County to them and their heirs forever

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto Daniel M. Ives one  
 Dollar to him and his heirs forever. My will and desire  
 is that my three youngest sons Richard, Malachi  
 and George St. Roby should receive a liberal education  
 out of the Bounties of the Farm, that I bequeathed  
 unto my wife Anna Roby, and also my will and  
 desire is that at the death or intermarriage of my wife  
 Anna Roby, that the plantation and land whereon  
 I now live should be equally divided  
 between my two youngest sons Malachi & George St. Roby  
 I also give and bequeath unto my beloved children, namely  
 Jane, Williamson, Robert, Martha, Eliza, Susan, Richard  
 Malachi, and George St. Roby all the personal property  
 that I now own or claim to be equally divided among

every part of this to the fully paying all former Wills  
by me made or made up of writing my hand and

Georgia Putnam County I, Isa Reads of the County and State aforesaid, being full in body, but  
sound in judgment and in mind at the present time, for  
which I desire to be truly to God, But knowing that it is  
appointed once for all to die, I do now in the name of  
God, Make Constitute and ordain this to be my last  
Will, and Testament & by these presents I do revoke and  
annul all former Wills heretofore made by me  
1<sup>st</sup> I will that my body be decently buried in a Christian  
like manner  
2<sup>nd</sup> I will out of my Estate all my just debts be  
first paid, out of the money arising from the sale  
of property which hereafter shall be mentioned  
3<sup>rd</sup> I will to my two Grand Children, Heirs of my son  
Hiram Reads & Sarah Reads his wife this is to  
Rebecca Ann Elizabeth Reads & James Washington  
Reads, and to all the heirs that may lawfully descend  
from my son Hiram Reads to be equally  
divided among them after his death, but to be used  
for the support of my two Grand Children aforesaid & all  
other Lawful heirs that may descend from him  
All that Tract or parcel of Land, Lying & being in  
the County of Putnam containing One Hundred and  
Six Acres more or less it being known as the
