 Husbands 3rd I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Jane Jackson
 three Negroes Namely Polly Treary & Charlotte together with all that
 I have given her hitherto 4th I give & bequeath unto my Daughter
 Anna Carol Ann Negroes Namely Aaron Abs. & Sarah together with
 all that I have given her hitherto 5th I give & bequeath unto my
 Daughter Perry Person three Negroes Namely Polly Bird & Rachel
 to be kept together by my Executors for the Use of herself & Children
 during her Natural Life and to be Equally divided between her
 three Children Patsy Perry & James Person so as to prevent the
 said Negroes from being sold from them and the proceeds raised by
 selling the Person her husband together with her Distribution share
