 and Meredith Kendrick my lawful Executors

during her life or widowhood at her death or mar-
riage I Give the Whole of my Estate of every descrip-
tion to my dear beloved Son Henry Rees Stembrage and Gibney
Temple to them and their heirs forever to be Equally Divided
between them. Except two hundred dollars which I
Give to my said Son Henry Rees Stembrage to be paid
him out of my Estate before any division.
it is my particular Request that my dear beloved
wife Betsy Stembrage & particular friend William
Hudson being Executors and Executors to this my last
Will & Testament in Witness I have hereunto
set my hand & Seal this 12 day of May 1822
