sold by my executors and the money to be applied to the payment of William Watkins
debt, and the other outstanding debts against my estate.

Item 2. I will and bequeath unto my son John Cotton all that tract or parcel of land lying on the west side of main creek together with all the appurtenances thereunto belongeth, and imfurnished and furnished it being in full of proportionable part of

my wish. Item 3rd It is my further wish and desire that the plantation or tract
of land I now live on and all the stock, and the remaining part of the negroes -

to be kept together by my exerting as a fund for raising and supporting and educating my wife and children. Item 4th It is my express will and desire that when the sum

your yet-child becomes of age or marries that my estate be equally divided among my wife, mine, John and my beloved children viz Elizabeth Thos or Louis John

our beloved all as from City, each throws part for a horse and harness
