 following that is to say I do hereby devise and
 bequeath to my beloved wife Martha Wall
 all my property both real and personal of
 every sort and quality for the space of her
 natural life and she the said Martha is
 bound by the ties of nature and by this my
 last will and Testament to take care of my
 daughter Elizabeth Wall and that my said
 wife Martha hath the right to use all or any
 part of said Estate for the comfort and benefit
 of herself and daughter or both or at any
 time when she may see fit my stock or property
 of any kind that she may think it not profitable
 to keep she may dispose of the same as it may
 best suit her and the same shall be right
 and proper and after the death of my wife
 Martha the balance of the property that she has
 not consumed shall be distributed as follows
 first my daughter Elizabeth Wall is to have
 twenty Dollars and then the remainder portion
 to be equally divided between the said
 Elizabeth and all the rest of my children
 she and she or like after the aforesaid
 twenty dollars to the said Elizabeth
 and I do hereby appoint my son John
 Wall and son in law Thomas Green
 to execute this my last will and Testament
 in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and seal to this my last will and
 Testament this twentieth day of January Eighteen

same freely and without compulsion

himself and in open Court and subscribed
this 7th day of June 1858

Know all to whom it may concern that on
the first Monday in June 1858 the last will
and testament of Oney Mace deceased
at the time of his death a resident of said
County was legally proved at the High Court
of the County of ordinary a copy of which
is annexed duly certified at which time an
order was also taken to allow David
Green named Executor in said will
to qualify and that the testamentary
should issue to him upon qualifying as
said Executor, now therefore the said
David Green having taken the oath
of office and complying with all
necessary requisites of the law said Green

is legally authorized to discharge all the
duties of an Executor on the will of Henry
Wall to administer the property of said
deceased which is devised according
to the will and requires to render a true
and perfect inventory and appraisement
of all and singular the goods and
chattels rights and credits of said deceased
and make return of them to the ordinary
of said County and further to report
annually to the same officer the situation
of said Estate his acting and doing
until his Executorship is fully discharged
under my hand and official
Seal this 27th August 1861
