 and condition in life my soul will
 I trust return to rest with God
 who I am I as hope for Salvation
 through the merits and atonement
 of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus

Secondly I direct and direct that
 all my just debts be paid without
 delay by my Executor herein app-
 ointed or named Thirdly I give
 and bequeath and devise to my
 beloved Mother Margaret E. McHenry
 my old mare fair at
 the rate of one hundred and
 Ten Dollars all my hogs
 at the rate of one hundred
 and twenty five dollars

Fourthly I give and bequeath
 to my beloved Brother William M
 McKinney part of Lot of Land
 No 148 in the Second District
 of Rabun County Georgia con-
 taining one hundred Acres more
 or less with all the rights, members
 and appurtenances to said Lot of
 Land in any wise belonging
 free from all charge and
 limitation whatever at the rate
 of three hundred Dollars to his
 own proper use benefit and
 behoof forever with full power
 to dispose of the same by will
 or other wise as he may deem
 proper I allow give and bequeath
 to my beloved Brother William
 McKinney in the same un-
 reserved manner one small
 male at the rate of Eighty
 five Dollars also one saddle
 at eighteen Dollars

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Fifthly I give and bequeath
 to my beloved Sister Margaret
 McKinney my large bay
 mare at the rate of one
 hundred and fifty Dollars
 I also give and bequeath one
 Cow and calf of Dun Color
 at the rate of thirty five Doll-
 ars also one Silver watch
 at the rate of Twenty
 Dollars

Sixthly I give and bequeath to the remaining beloved brother and sister To wit - George W. McKinnin Charles E. McKinnin Elizabeth A. Dillard and Rachael M. Dillard the sum of Ten Dollars each to be paid in money

Seventhly I give and bequeath to my Nephew James Doctor Marshall Ten Dollars in money &-

Eighthly I also give and bequeath to my Mother Margaret E. McKinnin my Brother William McKinnin my Sister Margaret C. McKinnin all of my remaining property in my possession and all money due ^{Kabun County Wills 1857-1867} ^{www.georgiapioneers.com} to or account from the Confederate States of America to be equally divided and each to be made equal to the other from the excess paid in the above will of property at its appraised Value amounts attached

Ninthly I also bequeath and give to my beloved William McKinnin and my sister Margaret C. McKinnin all of my interest in the unsold and undivided property and Estate known as the Home Place being the Lot No 177 and part of Lot No 160 all in the Second District of Rabun County Ga. also all my interest in the negro in my now in my Mother's possession

To wit one Negro Man named
Alfred about 33 years old one
Negro Woman named Mahala
aged 40 years
