Bryan my Eldest son to Lovin C. Bryan my youngest and last son

property of any description not given in this my Last Will & Testament
sold after my decease & the profits equally divided amongst all
my children heirs and after all my just debts are paid which are few
None I wish all my Ready Cash which I have together with all the
Notes & accounts which are due me collected to be also equally divided
between my heirs And I do hereby cancel and revoke all wills or
parts of wills which I may have made at any other time the deeds of
gifts & bills of sale which I have heretofore given some of my
children only standing good & valid I further give unto my wife
Edith Bryan the same as the above was eleven five little young
sons & daughters — And I do hereby appoint my three sons my
lawful executors Edward Readham Jr & David C. Bryan to this my
Last Will & Testament
