shall be thereunto required; and such Goods, Chattels and Credits

a just and true account of all actions and doings there on when
Required by the Superior Court on Register of probates for the
County; and all the rest of the Goods Chattels and Credits, which
shall be found remaining upon the account of the said Adminis-
tration, the same being first allowed by the said Court, shall
deliver and pay to such persons respectively, as are entitled to the same
by Law, and if it shall hereafter appear, that any last will and
