The Conditions of the above Obligation is such that if the above
Isaac Carter Administrator of the Goods chattles and credits of James
Carter Late of this County deceased, do make a true and perfect Inventory
of all and singular the Goods chattles and credits of the said deceased
which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said
Isaac A. Carter or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons
for him; and the same so made, do exhibit into the said Court of Ordinary, where
he shall be thereunto required; and such Goods, chattles and credits as
well and truly administer according to Law, and do make a Just and
true account of his actings and doings thereon, when required by the
Superior Court or Register of Probates for the County, And all the rest
of the Goods chattles and credits, which shall be found remaining upon
account of the said administration, the same being first allowed by the
said Court, shall deliver and pay to such persons respectively, as are due
to the same by Law, and if it shall hereafter appear, that any Last will
and testament was made by the said deceased, and the same be proved
before the Court, and the Executors obtain a Certificate of the Probate
