a true and faithful Inventory of all the Estate both Real and personal
of Said deceased, which have or shall come into the hands possession or
knowledge of the said Mary P. Maynard or into the hands or possession
of any other person or persons for her and the same so made do Exhibit
into the said Court of ordinary when she shall be thereunto Required
and such Estates do well and truly administer according to Law and do
make a Just and true account of her acting and doings therein when
she shall be thereunto Required by the Court of ordinary for said
County, and all the Rest of the said Estates which shall be found
remaining upon the account of the said administration, the same being
first allowed by the Court, shall deliver and pay to such person
or persons respectively as are entitled to the same by Law; and if it
shall hereafter appear that any last will and testament was made
