Last Will & Testament - (Viz) First I Give unto my Daughter
Frances Jane Baker one Negro Girl named Roddy & her
Increase and half of Lot of Land No 1477 one hundred &
forty seven in the Seventh District of Originally Lee Now Randolph
County likewise half of all the Stock of Cattle & Hogs & Horses &
half of all the household & Kitchen Furniture provided the said
Frances Jane should die before she come of age or married
and left no heir then to above property to go to my Grand Child William
Baker - Secondly I Give to my beloved Wife Jane & Baker
one Negro Boy named Roy & half of Lot of Land No 1477 one hundred &
forty seven in the Seventh District of Originally Lee Now
Randolph County likewise half of all the Stock of Cattle & Hogs
& Horses & household & Kitchen Furniture & plantation tools -
together with all debts due me by Note or otherwise provided my
Wife Jane should die before my Daughter Frances Jane then her
part to be given to my Daughter Frances Jane provided my Wif
should marry again and have an heir or being then the proper
to go to the said of her body or provided my Daughter Frances
Jane should die before my Wife & Leave no heir then my Wif
can dispose of her own part of the property so she thinks fit
Lastly I constitute nominate and appoint my beloved
Wife Jane & Baker my Executrix and Joseph Lucas
Adams Executor of this my Last Will and Testament this 22nd August

Remarks) - All the property was kept together during the year 1838 and Ashley & McMichael employed as an overseer the Crop produced \$2796.16 in Cotton after paying the Overseer but there was not sufficient provisions made for the support of the Family on the 17th Feb last the property was divided between the Distributors Except the Land & one Negro Women which the freeholders directed to be sold in order to make an Equal Division In order to carry on the present Crop the freeholder was compelled to purchase provisions for the support of the Family as above for the horses &c
