I give and bequeath to the managers of the free school here, to be kept open, and their successors in office, twenty shares of stock in the Bank of Augusta, the semi annual dividends shall be applied to the education and support of my said son George Claiborne Watting, while he continues in said school, and after his death, to revert to my Executors hereafter named to be applied to the use and benefit of my said son George Claiborne Watting, at the discretion of my said Executors hereafter named.

I give and bequeath to my Executors hereafter named twenty shares of stock in the Capital Stock Bank of Augusta, in trust for the use and benefit of my said son George Claiborne Watting, son of my deceased Brother Isaac Watting, the semi annual dividends of which shall be applied to the education and support of my said Nephew until he shall arrive to the age of twenty one years, after which he is to be invested with the control of said stock and its proceeds.

It is my Will and desire that the residue of my Estate both real and personal, after complying with the foregoing and subsequent bequests be equally divided between the children of my brother George Watting, the children of my brother John Hughes Nichols of Kentucky, and the children of my deceased brother of Arkansas Territory, Isaac Watting Shaw and Shaw sister, to be held to their heirs and assigns forever.

I give and bequeath to my three Executors hereafter named twenty shares of stock in the Bank of Augusta, to be set apart out of my Estate before making a final distribution thereof to be applied to their own use, and which I beg they will accept of as a small compensation for their trouble in carrying into effect the my last Will & Testament.

I do hereby appoint my truly and worthy friends, John Bono, William Bono, and Paul F. Cove, the sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament, vesting them with full powers to sell and dispose of my Estate both real and personal at their discretion in order to effect a final distribution of my said Estate, as fully as I myself could be enabled to do, and of whom I the aforesaid Andros Watting doth hereby certify and seal to this my last Will and Testament at the City of Augusta, Georgia, this 10th day of June 1828.
