Allegiant to the King of Great Britain Washington Bowdoin Clerk
of the Court of Ordinary. I leave my Son Robert Bowdoin ten
percent of my property Lands Negroes or Money, the
household furniture plantation tools to be equally divided
between my wife Ruth May and May Bowdoin and at her death
between my son Robert P. May Bowdoin to pay each of my
children fifty dollars as they come to the years of attaining
majority my last this fourteenth Day of May in the year
of our Lord eight hundred and fourteen.

Witness my hand and seal this fourteenth Day of May in the year
of our Lord eight hundred and fourteen.
