Whereas I find it necessary for settling of my estate to give notice to the remainder of the said business in the most convenient manner, and to the best of my power to express my desire in regard to the disposal of the same, I hereby give notice to all persons at the time of my decease

In the first place there is the stock & trade of Sack & Co. (which said stock well shew) was put in altogether by me, & was a small business, & was put in by him last season, In case of my decease I would have the same closed with all convenient speed, the debts of the said business cleared up, and all my lawful debts, W^m M^r Sack in by an agreement of a copy of which accompanying this is entitled to one half of the profits arising from the business done under that Partnership, which commenced on the 10th March 1796. on the winding up of the said concern of Sack & Co, I bequeath one half of the whole net proceeds thereof, & belonging to me as also any other personal property to my good & affectionate parents James and Mary Innes (who by their last wills bequeath the same to the one living at Pennackhill near Kelso in Scotland) and I wish my dear Peggy do her particular attention to them to participate with them, and at their decease that she possess one half, & the remaining half shall be equally divided between James & John Innes or their heirs, when I say their I mean their children begotten in wedlock, then the other half of all my personal property I bequeath to James W^m & M^r Lewis of London and also all my real property I bequeath to the said James, which consists of the two tenements on Broad Street Augusta, at present occupied by W^m M^r Sack & Co & David Reid & Co together making the entire lot as sold by the Commissioners & known by the number thirty seven, and all that tract of land in the County of Richmond whereon the Paper Works is, and also two tracts of land purchased in payment from John Innes lying on the River of the James my five hundred & seventy five acres, there is also a tract of seven hundred acres I received in payment from the same John Innes I consider it only as personal estate, as by agreement it was to be so, & my demands paid back to him, & for the better execution of the above I desire that all who are in any way interested, that they may appear at the Court of Chancery at Richmond & only W^m M^r Sack & Co & David Reid & Co
