

1791. I have been called to this Vegetarian, manner, of the
County of Chatham, State of Georgia, being in good health
and of sound and disposing mind, but mindful of the uncertainty
of life, and desiring to make a disposition of my worldly estate, do
make this my last will and testament, in manner and form fol-
lowing, viz:

First I bequeath my soul to God, who gave it, and desire that my
body may be interred in a Christian like manner.

I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid by my Executors, as soon as practicable after my decease.

Third, I give, devise and bequeath unto my sister Mary Fox, her heirs and assigns, all my farm in Richmond County, called Stockade together with all the household and kitchen furniture in the buildings thereon and all the stocks of every kind and farming utensils at the said place - also the following negro slaves, namely: Mophon, his wife Sarah and her two children John and Owen, Phillis, Titus, Jim, Aaron, Nancy, Peggy, Mary, Rose and Nelson - and my carriage and horses.

Months I give, dearest and Sigisberto write my niece Anna E. Jackson, her
hus and assigns one half of the furniture at my plantation in Pinar
del Rio and also the following negro slaves, namely: old Sally, Maria
a, Phoebe, Hannah.

15th, I give, devise and bequeath unto William E Jackson and Jane
W Jackson and their heirs, the following negro slaves, namely, Charlotte
Sophia, Abby and Celia and one half of the furniture at my plantation
near in Burke County. In trust to and for the sole and separate
use benefit and behoof of Mary Ann Venderly the wife of Benjamin
Venderly without the same in any part or the income thereof being
liable for the debts or contracts of her husband, her heirs and assigns

latter, I sold him and his wife into my grand nephew Mr. E. Jackson his time and agrees the following negro slaves, namely Little Aaron, Venter and Murrell.

Samuel. I give down and beneath unto my grand nephews
and Nephews his line and assigns the following negro slaves, namely,
John, Phillis, London and Harriet.

Little I give and I give with my grand nephew Samuel
 one of Benjamin that has been and assigns three negro slaves, now
 William, and I give and I give to my grand nephew John
 and of Benjamin and I give and I give and I give and I give
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Fourth I give and bequeath unto my grand niece Amelia Smith
wife of Albert Austins now or lately of Morgan County) three negro
boys, Judy, Louisa and Caroline to and for her sole and separate
use and benefit, without the consent or any part or the increase or
decrease thereof, being liable for the debts or contracts of her husband.

Fifth I give and bequeath unto my grand nephew Richard Fox
son of Richard Fox) his heirs and assigns five negro slaves, namely,
Samuel, Cuffy, Flora and Sami.

Sixth I give and bequeath to my nephew Benjamin Fox his
heirs and assigns five negro slaves, namely, Sam, Dexter, Isaac,
Adam and Suck:

Seventh I give and bequeath unto Mr. Ann. Murphy wife of Mr.
Nicholas Murphy, two negro slaves, namely, Sally and her child.

Eighth I give and bequeath unto Mr. Julia Polk wife of Joseph
Polk the sum of two hundred dollars; to Mr. Machare Gaddy of
Troup County, the sum of two hundred dollars; to my grand nephew
Samuel M Jackson the sum of five hundred dollars; to my grand
nephew Steele White the sum of five hundred dollars; to my nephew
Richard Fox, the sum of five hundred dollars; to Edward Bourgeois
and Stephen Bourgeois (son of Francis Bourgeois of Chatham County)
the sum of five hundred dollars each; and to Mr. Margaret
ward (wife of Timothy Barnes of Chatham County) the sum of
five hundred dollars.

Ninth I hereby charge all my real and personal estate, not spe-
cially devised, with the payment of my debts and the pecuniary leg-
acies above mentioned, and I trust that my executors shall see
and dispose of the same for that purpose, at such times and in such
manner as to them may seem best (without their obtaining pre-
mission of the Court of Ordinary) and all the rest and residue
remaining after the payment of my debts and the said legacies
I give and bequeath unto my grand son E Jackson and
grand nephews William E Jackson and James M Jackson.

are dated between the three.
Between the Defendant and Andrus J. Miller and Samuel
W. Jackson witnesses of this my last will and testament.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, the
twenty second day of September, A.D. 1835, and thirty years.
And the want of any of the negro slaves before mentioned having, or
child or children after this date I desire that such child or children
shall go to the person or persons to whom I have bequeathed the mother
or mothers respectively.
