

In witness whereof I have signed this 2^d 1839

In the name of the most Holy and undivided Trinity
Father Son and Holy Ghost Amen

I Thomas McKinnay being in danger of death by sickness but thanks
be to God in the enjoyment of perfect mind and understanding do make
this my last will and Testament

First I wish that all my debts be discharged and my funeral expenses
be defrayed out of the money deposited by the Rev John Barry in the
First Bank of this city viz 375 dollars and the money due to me by the
Company who this year have collected moneys near the most New River
Crack and the recovery of which I have given into the hands of Andrew
J Miller Esq

Secondly I will and bequeath one hundred dollars to my beloved
father Matthew McKinnay of the Townsland of Herrensland Parish of Down
Barony of Lower Stoney county Meath Ireland but in the event of
his death before my execution shall make the bequestance I wish
that the said hundred dollars be appropriated and disbursed for the
residue which I shall hereafter bequeath

Thirdly the residue of the aforesaid money together with one
dollar and the interest thereof which I deposited in the Merchants
Bank and the city of Boston Mass on the 11th December 1838 I
will and bequeath to the Rev John Barry to be disposed of by him in
Religious and Charitable objects according to his prudence and judgment
without being influenced by any other motive than the love of my
God and the salvation of my soul I make this my last will and testament
I hereby appoint Francis Miller and John J Haquin Executors the execution
of this my will
