

The last Will and Testament of Christopher Gray, of the City of Augusta and State of Georgia. I Christopher Gray, being weak in body but of sound mind and memory (blessed be Almighty God, for the same), do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say. First I will and bequeath my negro girl Rosetta, and her future increase, to my friend Simeon Lusk, in full confidence that he will grant her every privilege, which is my wish, and that, should it ever be consistent with the Laws of this State, he will emancipate her. Item, I will and order that the lot of land I now live, together with all the balance of my property, be sold as soon as convenient, and that all ^{my} just debts be paid out of the proceeds and the balance I give and bequeath to my beloved son, John Henderson. It is my will and desire that my neighbour, John Henderson, should purchase the lot on which I live, as he has for a long time desired all the rest of the property of which the said lot hereunto is a small part and for that purpose that the terms be made as favorable to him as possible. Lastly, I appoint my friends, James H. Walker and Norman Walker Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills by me made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this third day of March 1844.
