Samuel Savage of the State of Virginia, Richmond County, be-
ing sound mind but in declining health - Do make this my last
will and Testament - viz.

I will and bequeath to my beloved wife all and every manner and
species of Property (without exception) that she had or had in
possession, previous to our intermarriage, and not to be meddling or
interfered with by my Executors, no more than she we never had been
married - she however to pay out of the same the debts due and con-
fessed by her before our marriage. -

I give to my son Caesar A. Savage, my watch.

to my Daughter Ann S. Savage, my Bedstead, Bed, Mattress and Bed-
clothing - also a small set of Drawers with a Toilet Stool on them.

I give to my son Edmund S. Savage, a negro boy called Washington.

I give to my daughter Sarah S. Savage, a mulatto Girl called Eliza -

The remainder of my property of every description, after paying my just
debts, I wish equally divided between my Step-Daughter Mary A. Senead &
my four Children before named - to each one of the five an equal share;
but it is my will that my man, servant called Chas, in any division
or distribution that may take place, shall not be allotted to any of them,
but kept at such price as my Executors may think proper to allow to the
youngest Child that may live to become of age or marry: after which, it
is my desire, he should be in every respect a free man, or as free as the
Laws of the State will allow him - with a request that my Executors
will protect him, and if he should wish to leave the State, furnish
him with all the necessary papers to entitle him a free passport.

If it should so happen, that none of my children viz Caesar, Ann,
Edmund or Sarah should live to become of age, it is my will that what
my property may be left shall be equally divided between my wife, my
mother, my Step-Daughter Mary A. Senead, each to share alike; but if
my wife should not be living, her proportion to go to my Brother William
Savage & my Sister Ann Bush.

I nominate and appoint my Friend Edmund B. Gladock and my Brother Wm B.
Savage my Executors, with full power and authority to sell, buy or exchange or dis-
pose of in any manner any property or species of property that their Judgment
may dictate in as full and ample a manner as I could do, if I were com-
petent.

Since writing the above, I have sold to Wm Gladock, in payment of a debt
due to his wife, my Lot at the Sand Hills, valued at one thousand Dollars.
It is now that each of my children has received his or her share of the
Richmond Co

Property to make equal with
 that be entitled to any thing from
 the property of the same estate, then if there shall be any thing
 due to them equally with my own children, as my intention always
 has been that the same should have equal with my own children
 let my estate be large or small
 It is my will and will that if any thing herein written or expressed shall
 be so as to admit of different construction that my Executors shall do as
 they think right, without any reference to the Law, as I have explained
 and told them verbally my will in many matters not herein mentioned
 The Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and
 Seal this 11th day of March 1831.
