

In the name of God I David Bush of the County of Columbia and State of Georgia, being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make and publish my last Will and Testament in manner and form following to wit:

First, I give and bequeath unto George Hargraves, Esquire, of the City of Savannah, and Peter Crawford of the County of Columbia and State of Georgia, all my goods, and Chattels, Lands and Tenements, and personal property, whosoever, that I may be in possession of or entitled to, at the time of my death, unto them, to and for the sole use and benefit, if such persons, or for such uses and purposes as I may in a confidential manner direct, by written instructions under my hand and seal, after my death, after a full confidence in the integrity of my Executors hereinafter named, it is my Will desired that after proving this my last Will and Testament, making an appraisement of my Estate, and returning the same, to the Court of Ordinary. That my Executor or Executors hereinafter named, shall not be compelled, or bound, to make any return, or settlement of accounts, or other actings and doings, with management or disposition of my property, to the Court of Ordinary, when this my last Will and Testament may be proven and recorded in any other Court in the State aforesaid, as required by the Laws of the State of Georgia, now in force, for the direction and Government of Executors and so forth.

Lastly, I do appoint my friends, George Hargraves of the City of Savannah and Peter Crawford of Columbia County, Executors of this my last Will and Testament, (the former to have the sole direction and disposition of my Estate, in and out of the County of Columbia, and in the event of his death or declining to act, the latter is authorized to make a full and complete settlement and disposition of my Estate) hereby ratifying and confirming this my last Will and Testament, and revoking all other Will or Wills heretofore made by me.

In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the eighth day of June 1820.

Witnessed and pronounced by the Testator as his last Will and Testament, and witnessed by us in the presence and in the presence of each other.

State of Georgia, Richmond County, February 17th 1826

I Nancy Lumpkin of the State and County aforesaid being
sound and disposing mind memory and understanding and at the same
time considering the uncertainty of this life determined to make my last Will
& Testament and my Will and desire is after paying all my just debts
and funeral expences; I give devise & bequeath to my son Jacob Bugg one
Plantation or Tract of Land known as the former residence of Jacob Bugg's
and containing fifty four Acres more or less lying and being in the County
and State aforesaid and joining Land of E. Bugg & Anderson Watkins. So
that the said Jacob Bugg his heirs and assigns the said tract of land forever
I give and bequeath to my Daughter Obadience Bugg a negro woman
named Hannah to her & her Executors Administrators and assigns forever
I give and bequeath to my son E. Bugg and E. Bugg as trustee for
him and my two Daughters Sarah Lark and Mary Bugg three negro
named Abby, Betty & Jerry to be equally divided by sale or division as
they may think proper to them their Executors Administrators and assigns
I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Francis Ann Cook
my child named Richard to her & her Executors Administrators and assigns
I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Mary Elizabeth Cook
my child named Katy to her & her Executors Administrators and assigns
