My Executor, hereinafter to pay these sums with
out, out of my property, to the persons that may legally out-
stand the same.

I make the residue of my property both Real & personal, to my
said daughter, during the period of her remaining my Widow, and
when she ceases to be my Widow, either by Marriage, or death,
then I give to the Grandson of my brother William Small, now
bearing the name of Dennis Small Winston, now of the County
of Chatham, & County of Chatham the said aforementioned property
with the profits, to him and his heirs forever, with this only exception
that my little Negro boy Henry, now about three years old,
the son of my servant Betsey be bound at the age of fourteen
years, to be good tradesman, till he arrives at the age of
twenty years, & then it is my Will, that he may be emancipated
by my said friend James Fraser, my Executor.
I have signed my hand & seal in the State of Georgia this
1st day of August 1818.

Estate both Real and personal, for and during her natural life.
Upon the death of my said Wife Martha Crook, my Will
Pleasure is and I do will bequeath and devise all my said
Estate both Real and Personal and in which I have resided
life Estate to my Wife Martha unto my beloved Grand Children
Jonathan Lyon, John Lyon, Patsy Lyon, and James Lyon,
and their heirs forever equally to be divided among them,
and share alike, and lastly I nominate and appoint my
only friend Lewis Collins esquire Executor to this my last
Will and Testament this 10th day of September in the year of
1818 One thousand eight hundred & 18
