

Georgia. In the Name of God, Amen.

This is the last Will and Testament of our Robert Dixon of the Town of Augusta, County and State aforesaid as follows. I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Anne Dixon the House and Lot whereon I now live, in the Town of Augusta and all my house hold furniture and Stock, of what kind and kind so ever, also the following Negroes, that is to say Dick, Phill, Harry, Jane, Jane Kate, Phillis, Aaron and Sam, to possess unmolested the House, Lot, House hold furniture and Negroes aforesaid during her natural Life, or so long as she may remain unmarried, and at the Decease of my Wife, or when she shall again Marry it is my Will, that the House and Lot should be united and become the right and property of my three eldest Sons John Lyddall Dixon, Henry Dixon, and Solomon Dixon, to hold the said Lot of Land and the Appurtenances as in them the said John Lyddall, Henry and Solomon, and to their heirs and Offspring for ever, Share and Share alike, and further, that on the death of my Wife, or her intestacy it is my Will that the Negroes herein before mentioned that is to say, Dick, Phill, Harry, Jane, Jane Kate, Phillis, Aaron and Sam, and their future increase, shall be equally divided among my several Children following that is to say, John Lyddall Dixon, Henry Dixon, Solomon Dixon, Sarah Packer Dixon, Ann Dixon, Caroline, William Dixon and Maria Pelixina Dixon and the Survivors of them after they shall come to lawful age, or Marry.

Whereas in Virtue of my marriage with my Wife Anne Dixon I shall be entitled to have and receive of and from the Estate of Lyddall Bacon father to my wife's Mother a Certain legacy mentioned in the last Will and Testament of the said Lyddall Bacon, it is therefore my Will and desire, that the same to be vested on the death of Mary Bacon shall be paid to the Representatives of the said Mary Bacon, during

life a Whore, and at her death, or intermarriage
to be equally divided among my seven children as now
mentioned, share and share alike.

Now I give and devise unto my three sons John
Lyndall Dixon, Henry Dixon, and Silman Dixon
all my real Estate, Land and Tenements, of what
Nature or kind soever, to have and to hold the same
in equal Division to them and every of them their
heirs and assigns for ever, Subject however to this
proviso, that my Wife Ann Dixon during her Natu-
-ral life, or untill her marriage, shall and may at
all times cultivate any of my Land now unimpro-
-ved with the Negroes by this Will bequeathed to her
So as not to interfere with any plantation, or plantati-
-ons which my sons may have settled, or built upon
and it is my further Will and desire that my son John
Lyndall Dixon at the time of the division of my real
Estate, shall in his division have included that part of
the tract of Land on Buffalo Waters in the County of Wash-
-ington wherein he hath made improvements.

Now I give and bequeath unto my son John Lyndall Dixon
one African man Slave Jack to him and his heirs for ever
Now I give and bequeath unto my son Henry Dixon one
Negro Woman Slave Jenny and her future increase to
him and his heirs for ever.

Now I give and bequeath unto my son Silman Dixon
one African boy Slave Saml to him and his heirs for ever.
Now I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Parks
one African boy Slave Lucy and her increase to
her and her heirs for ever.

Now I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Anna Dixon
one African boy Slave William the child of Phillis to her
and her heirs for ever.

Now I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Caroline
one African boy Slave the child of Phillis to her
and her heirs for ever.

Now I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Maria
Dixon One Negro Boy Dick, the Child of Phillis, to her and
her heirs for ever.

Now it is my further Will and desire that if any Negro
desires to either of the female Legatee now under age, should
die before such female Legatee should come to lawful
age or marry, that then the female Legatee shall
contribute equally to raise for such unfortunate female
Legatee a Negro of equal Value.

Now I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my
Wife Ann Dixon, John Lydell Dixon, Henry Dixon
and Silman Dixon Executors of this my last Will
and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all
other Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made.

Seal the 26th day of October 1792.
