And the balance of money due me by note and account I give to my beloved
Father & Mother.

To the children of Edmund Murphy deceased, to wit, Nicholas Mary Rainey, (the wife of Charles Rainey) Mariah Brown, (the wife of Samuel Brown) Alexander, Elizabeth Ann Evans, (the wife of Robert Evans) and Leroy H. to them and their Heirs forever, I give, devise and bequeath, share and share alike, the tract of Land in Burke County whereon I formerly resided.

It is my will that my negroes Suett, Pollen, and her three children Winney, Dennis and Jenny and any increase that there may be of the female part of them, at the time of my death, in order to prevent their being separated, be sold by my Executors herein after named, for the benefit of the aforesaid children of the said Edmund Murphy deceased, and the proceeds of the sale be paid over to them, share and share alike by my Executors herein after named as aforesaid.

To my Brother Absalom Rhodes and his Heirs forever, I give, devise and bequeath my two old negroes Dennis & Elly.

I give, devise and bequeath to the children of my said Brother Absalom Rhodes, to wit, John A. Elizabeth W. (the wife of Richard B. Day) Aaron, Vance B. Mary B. Lavinia, and Caroline Conelia Small, and to their Heirs forever, the following negro slaves, with any increase that there may be of them, at the time of my death, to wit, Sarah, Solomon, Simon, Gabriel, John, Mary Ann and Rachael, to be divided between them share and share alike, with the request however, that my said Brother Absalom Rhodes
